

## Service Pupil Premium Evaluation 2022-23

### Context

Total on roll: **178**

No. of children from military families: **14** (in November 2022)

Total funding **£4480**

At Princecroft Primary School, we currently have 14 children on roll who are in receipt of the service pupil premium. We are committed to providing an education that helps all children achieve the highest standards and prepares all pupils for the future. We aim to encourage and develop every child's personality, talents and abilities to the full, and strong consideration is given to the allocation of resources to support this vision. We recognise that the experience of children in the Armed Forces can be different from that experienced by many other children.

The Service Pupil Premium (SSP) was introduced by the Department of Education as part of the commitment to delivering the Armed Forces Covenant. This premium enables schools to provide extra, mainly pastoral, support for children with parents in the Armed Forces. The school receives £320 per service child.
